Bury Art Museum

Using the Art Museum's wonderful collection of Victorian paintings and a selection of objects, pupils will learn about Victorian society and the lives of people who helped build and develop Bury into an industrial centre.

The Fusilier Museum

Travel back in time and discover brave Victorian soldiers, early war photography and the fantastic Florence Nightingale. Pupils will become medal makers, explore exhibits and uncover the story of the Crimean War.

Bury Transport Museum

Using some of our large exhibits, children will find out about some types of transport in Victorian Britain. In the classroom, they will also look at advertising and make some coin rubbings.
