The History of ELR

Every journey on the East Lancashire Railway is a step back in time filled with the sights, sounds and smells of the region's rich heritage.

This magical slice of living history hasn't happened by accident or overnight, but has been the result of efforts by hundreds of people over decades.

So how did it all begin? The very first section of the line we use today opened in **1841** in Heywood and was extended three years later to bring the railway to the Irwell Valley.

BOLTON STREET STATION

LANCASHIRE & YORKSHIRE RAILE

The towns of the Irwell Valley relied greatly on the line - which they called the North-South route back then - as they grew during the Industrial Revolution.

The East Lancashire Railway Line was first used as a term in 1846. although it disappeared after just 13 years when the line merged with the Lancashire And Yorkshire Railwav.

Fast forward 100 years and diesel was replacing steam on the railway - while many passengers were ditching the train altogether in favour of the car.

In 1963, the infamous Beeching Report was published and whilst the Bury to Manchester line was reprieved, services to Rawtenstall were all but gone by the end of the decade.

Station buildings and bridges were demolished up and down the line during this time, in one of the darkest periods for rail travel in the UK.

However, all was not lost. In 1970, the East Lancashire Railway Preservation Society was founded with the aim of one day running trains on the line again. When a disused goods shed became available in 1972, the Bury **Transport Museum** opened to place a focus on the region's heritage and raise funds for restoration.

A decade later, the **ELR Trust** came into being. assuming control for the track and buildings that were still in existence along the line. This momentum led to the proud day in 1987 when a passenger train once again set off from Bury heading to Ramsbottom. In that first - short - season the ELR line was re-opened with more than 35.000 passengers.

By the 1990s, the line extended once more to Rawtenstall, with new and restored buildings and bridges along the way.

A further extension to Heywood from Bury meant visiting steam engines could ride the heritage line too and annual visitor numbers passed 100.000 then 200.000 as the calendar of events put on by our amazing team of volunteers and paid staff keeps people coming back.

Now with regular services in the peak season and regular events attracting families, foodies, day trippers and rail enthusiasts – not forgetting Santa! – there is something for everyone.





Bury Transport Museum

The **Bury Transport Museum** is about so much more than trains, it tells the stories of cars, trucks and buses too with some incredible and unique exhibits.

The development of the region in the 19th and 20th centuries coincided with dramatic changes in the way people travel - and at the museum you get up close to trams, coaches, cars, trucks and other vintage vehicles from the horse-drawn to steam and petrol powered.

Each one has a story to tell - the horse-drawn tram that was once a chip shop or the holiday coach that took sun-seekers from industrial Lancashire to the coast for a well-earned summer break.

No visit to the ELR is complete without a tour of this collection, all housed inside the restored **Castlecroft Goods Warehouse**, which dates from 1848.

There are hands-on exhibits, opportunities to dress up in period costume and special events across the year, including in the school holidays.

You will find the museum directly across the road from Bury Bolton Street Station. It's a short walk to transport yourself back to experience modes of travel through the ages across the region. Follow the signs to find us.

Heritage Pubs

In need of refuelling? There are two destination pubs at our stations that are well worth a visit - The Trackside and Buffer Stops.

In Bury, **The Trackside** is our pride and joy. Located on platform 2 of Bolton Street Station, this is an award-winning pub with a real point of difference. Where else is the beer garden an actual, working railway platform?

Newly restored and featuring guest ales and ciders, as well as a classy pub grub menu, The Trackside is a one-off experience you and your friends will be talking about for a long time to come.







Here at the end of the line you can also enjoy a drink in the cosy surroundings of our traditional style waiting room, or if the weather is kind, alongside the tracks on the station platform.

There are award-winning ales, great wines and a full range of bar snacks to keep you going on your visit to the ELR.
